Dear Cornell travelers abroad,

In today's headlines, President Trump declared a National Emergency due to COVID-19, and the U.S. Department of State issued a <u>level 3 global travel advisory</u>. Likewise, the CDC raised its <u>travel advisory</u> alert level to 2 (practice enhanced precautions) for the entire globe.

There are indications that the situation in Europe will get worse before it gets better, and that travel will be complicated world-wide. We encourage you to have a plan in case your local area announces stringent travel restrictions. In other words, have supplies available in your residence, build a network of contacts who you can reach out to for help, and figure out how you would access healthcare if needed.

Students abroad, in particular, should know how to access local healthcare providers and should check with their program or local hosts to find out what services remain available to you if the program or host university shuts down.

Prepare for evaluations (temperature-checks) and delays at all airports.
